As promised, we would like to give you an update of the work progress being done in the Ebenezer community, located in the municipality of Parramos.



Towards the end of June, following intense rains, and with two earthquakes of great magnitude, some of the Foundation families approached us to request support as they had the constant fear of a landslide in the community in which they live, Vista Hermosa. They were evacuated by the Municipality as it became unsafe and a dangerous place to live. Some of our families have been offered re-housing in Ebenezer.

You may remember us explaining the houses they were offered originally looked like this:



We launched an Emergency Appeal and this is where the wonderful EFTC Community stepped in.

With the fantastic news that our initial target was exceeded, we were able to begin working on house improvements in this challenging project.

The work done to date:

- Installation of ceilings to the houses that needed it.
- Installation of electrical wiring throughout the houses in the 5 homes.
- Electric post in 5 houses.
- Front tabs to 3 houses.
- Prepaid payments to electrical company



The improvements are not yet complete and we will continue working so the families our Foundation support can be relocated as soon as possible.
