

Rev Simon Tillotson writes:

We seem to be living in a more and more dangerous world. As I write, the terrorist attack in Barcelona took place just two days ago. The stand-off over North Korea continues to be a major potential flashpoint. Thousands of refugees and migrants continue to make their perilous way on makeshift rafts and boats across the Mediterranean. The USA seems to be becoming a more and more fractured society in terms of racial tensions. Here in the UK we have been shocked by terrorist attacks at various times in the last six months. I could continue... and have been reflecting on these issues over the last few weeks. What should our Christian response be?

Looking at the bible, we see issues such as wars and conflict as an almost constant backdrop in the Old Testament. In the New Testament. all the events are within the context of a Roman Occupation which was deeply disliked by the Jewish population and by other national groups of the time. So the fact is that political and global insecurity was a fact of life then as it is now.

Therefore our present day troubles should not be a surprise to us. Indeed, our whole Christian journey is one where we make a transition from trusting in the world to trusting in God, and the trials we encounter have the result of helping us in this process, even though they are often very unpleasant things in themselves.

Whatever may happen, says the writer of Psalm 46, we should still proclaim that "God is our Hope and Strength". My prayer is that whatever challenges we face, especially as a new school year begins, each of us will be able to draw on that Psalm and come closer to our Heavenly Father and find our strength in Him.
