

News from Children and Families Ministry....

Dear Church Family,

It continues to be both a joy and privilege to serve as Children and Families Minister here at Seasalter and as we start 2018 I feel a sense of excitement at what the year ahead may bring for us all.

At the end of 2017 we were seeing around 70 children with their parents/ carers coming to the Christian Centre during each week for activities such as Jelly Beanz, Pulse or Alphies. On Sundays we have around 40 children coming to worship and I'm also a frequent visitor to both our own Abbot House and Joy Lane School. The Family Fun Morning just before Christmas was attended by 120 children (Parents / carers extra!) and over half of them stayed for the Christingle Service at the end. Add in one off events such as Kickstart holiday clubs and I keep myself fairly busy.

The last year has been challenging for many of us for many reasons and I now find myself precariously short of helpers and leaders in many of the groups. Particular hot spots are

- Pulse
- Jelly Beanz
- Alphies
- Single events

Quite simply, I am very sad to acknowledge that we are now at a point where it will not be possible to carry on with the current level of activities unless we have more volunteers to help.

As this New Year starts please can you pray for me as I face these

challenges and also prayerfully consider whether God is calling you to be part of this exciting, challenging,

growing and fun ministry field.

I would be very happy to talk with anyone who would like to explore this further with me.

Sunday Groups: meet for around 30 minutes during the 11am service, term time only.

Sparks is our youngest group (0 to 4yrs) which meets in the crèche. Could you help with leading and storytelling, or thinking of, preparing and leading a craft or singing ?

• 3 people needed ~ time commitment variable on role

Flames our group for 5 to 7's who meet in Abbot House.

• always open to offers !

Energise The 7 to 11's meet in the Harbour Room.

an extra helper is needed once a fortnight, no time commitment other than the group on Sunday mornings

Hydr8: meets once a month and replaces all other Sunday groups so all children up to age 11 meet as one large group for just over an hour.

• A couple of extra helpers would be great!

Pulse: is our after-school club on Monday afternoons from 3.15 to 5pm. Children are aged 5 to 10 and around 30 – 40 children regularly attend. This is a purely social activity where we hope to build relationships with the children and their families. Can you lead a craft table, play board games, wash up, build Lego or meccano?

• 4 helpers urgently needed. Need to be available from 2.45pm until 5.30pm on Mondays (term time only)

Jelly Beanz: is our Baby and Toddler Group which meets on Tuesday afternoons from 1pm until 2.30pm. We are a fairly small group currently but we like to provide a range of activities from toys, a craft, to physical play as well as some stories and singing of course!

• 3 helpers urgently needed. Need to be available from mid day until 2.45pm on Tuesdays (term time only)

Alphies: is our special time for pre-schoolers with their parents / carers. We meet from mid day and share lunch together before holding a short age appropriate service which will include a bible passage as well as a craft or activity and some singing and prayer time.

• always open to offers !

One off events such as Family Fun Mornings, Kickstart holiday clubs. Frequency, type of help and time requirement varies depending on activity – normally only in school holidays.

• These activities are now on hold until we have at least 10 new volunteers.
