

Covid Christmas – Celebrating as usual

Although many of us have 'Family Traditions' when it comes to celebrating Christmas, for a variety of reasons each Christmas is a little different. 2020 will be different for whole populations and nations around the world.

Probably the last time there was such a difference for so many was during the second world war (1939 to 1945). Thousands of men and women were away serving in the armed forces and merchant navy. Food was rationed as was petrol but fewer people had cars and people were prepared to walk many miles in order to join family members and/or friends. For many, Christmas Day was not a holiday. In addition to those working to provide essential services, there were hundreds of volunteers on duty as Air Raid Wardens, members of the Home Guard, The Women's Voluntary Service and the Red Cross worked around the clock to provide and serve meals to individuals and families and generally care for those who had recently been bombed out and lost their homes and other possessions. Midwives, District Nurses and Doctors were often called out on Christmas Day – no National Health Service in those days.

Then of course there was the blackout to contend with but still, even then, nothing prevented those who could from celebrating Christmas, even if it meant spending part of the day or night in an air raid shelter. In my parents' home we always had a traditional dinner and tea with turkey and all the trimmings, vegetables all grown in the garden followed by Christmas pudding and mince pies, all homemade from ingredients mum managed to save up during the year. The decorations, mostly hand-made paper chains, went up as usual as did the Christmas tree festooned with any small thing we could find to put on it. Where possible, churches were open and the normal Christmas services took place and as usual the Salvation Army were out on Christmas morning playing carols. Many things were different but many were the same.

What about Christmas 2020 to be celebrated in the midst of the coronavirus pandemic? Some things will be different and others just the same. Although numbers will have to be limited, services will take place at Seasalter both late on Christmas Eve and on Christmas morning, and relayed courtesy of 'YouTube' into the homes of those who can't physically get to church. We may not be able to sing carols in church but there is nothing to stop us singing them in our homes. I have already started and there have been no complaints from neighbours so far.

Due to Covid 19 we won't be able to have a Post Box in the church this year and the Swalecliffe Scout troop are unable to operate their delivery service to raise funds for their troop. Delivery of our own cards is not advisable so I encourage you to do what a few of us have been doing for several years, send a Christmas Greeting Message to be included with the church notices on Sundays 13th and 20th December in their email and printed form. They will be in a format that when printed off can be folded into a card containing everyone's message/greeting. Our grateful thanks to Paula who has undertaken the job of producing the 'card'. Further important details about it are to found elsewhere in these notices. Please read the instructions carefully and act quickly.

Whilst we have to make changes as to how we celebrate Christmas this year, even a COVID CHRISTMAS can't in anyway change the message of Christmas and the implications of that message for our lives. I guess in the years to come when we are discussing Christmas 2020, one of the questions we will be asking each other is "And which tier were you in?"

WE WILL BE CELEBRATING THE BIRTH OF OUR SAVIOUR AS USUAL. HIS NAME IS 'JESUS' WHO IS 'CHRIST THE LORD'.

'CAP' Christians Against Poverty

As a 'follow up' to the video shown as part of last Sunday's Service, here are a few more details about 'CAP'.

It is a national Christian charity which we at St. Alphege Seasalter already support and with a local branch right here in Whitstable; with Joyce Mitchell, the wife of the Pastor of the church in Harbour Street, leading the team of volunteers who run it.

The organisation was founded in 1996 by John Kirby of Bradford, West Yorkshire and specialises particularly in 'Debt Counselling' for people in financial difficulties and is being swamped by enquirers during the present coronavirus pandemic when so many people have suddenly found that they no longer have a job.

The charity also runs 'Job Clubs' for those seeking employment and 'Life Still Groups' helping people with particular skills to survive whilst being paid low wages.

Last but not least CAP runs 'Fresh Start Courses' for people looking for help to overcome addictions and dependencies.
