

Re: German Exchange Wednesday 27 July to 31 July

I write to ask if you would be free to help us in the German Exchange which is from 27 to 31 July among the churches in Whitstable. Originally the Exchange was between All Saints' Whitstable and Kleines Wiesenthal in the Black Forest, South Germany and also Teltow, near Berlin. This year friends from all the Anglican churches and Whitstable URC and Baptist churches are also participating.

Our German friends are coming into Gatwick Airport, arriving between 18.00 and 19.25 on Wednesday 27th. They will be leaving Whitstable for Gatwick on Sunday 31st after lunch and no later than 14.00.


Help please!
