
Celebrating:


Help please!

Friday 24 June, 5 pm to midnight, SCC**

We want as many as possible to participate in this important event. These are the areas we are discerning God's call to pay particular attention to, and so we want to pray into these things as a church and hear what God is saying to us about them.

- **One Body** (1 Corinthians 12:12-21) unity even in our difference and disagreement, community, indispensable to each other, the jigsaw picture in the concourse.
- **Worship and Prayer** central to our thriving as Jesus' church here in Seasalter.
- **Relational** seeing God at work in our relationships and partnerships with each other and our neighbours in the community. Depth of relationship more important than project.
- **LOVE** over all of it (Colossians 3:1-15)

You can come to whatever parts of the evening you are able to attend.

There will be prayer stations and resources and the first part of the evening up to 9 pm will be guided (Auditorium). Throughout the evening there will also be a quiet prayer room (Harbour) and a room to pray with others (Oyster Bay) and refreshments available.

included to help with family logistics, with Pizza available from 5.30 – 6 pm.

10.00 a short form of Night Prayer (called Compline) after which SCC will remain open for prayer until midnight.
