# 'When we walk with the Lord in the light of his word . . . '

Those opening words from a well-known hymn about trusting and obeying God frequently come to my mind and the very idea of me walking with the Lord and He walking with me never seems to be out of my mind. The thought was heightened a few weeks' ago whilst reading Andrew Morton's biography 'The Queen'. Apparently on the evening before Princess Diana's funeral there remained one little problem that needed to be solved. Were Princes William and Harry going to walk behind their mother's coffin? It was for them to decide but it was Prince Philip, with whom they had a very good relationship, who helped them make up their minds by saying, 'If I walk, will you walk with me?' That's what actually happened with Philip chatting quietly to the two princes all the way to Westminster Abbey.

There they were in the company of someone they loved and trusted, someone who wanted to help them in a time of sorrow and suffering, someone who cared about them, someone who understood what they were going through, someone who . . . . . . which led me to think of Jesus and His walk with me and mine with Him, a walk I have had now during 70 of the 91 years of my earthly life, a walk with a journey where the best is yet to come, a walk that continues throughout eternity.

Having shared this brief testimony in church on Easter Day I have asked for it to be included in these notices for the benefit of those who, for whatever reason, were unable to be there and because I want to tell you of the 'God incidence' that goes with it. The 'Every Day with Jesus' bible notes on Monday 10 April, based on the walk to Emmaus event recorded in Luke's gospel, ended with this sentence: 'As we take time to consider our walk with Him, we will surely be able to discern His presence, walking with us.


