SCC CAR PARK

On a number of occasions when SCC is busy, we have noticed that vehicles have not been parked in marked bays and have been parked either at the end of a row or on the kerb/grass adjacent to the SCC building. We are concerned that these actions reduce the amount of room available for vehicles to move safely around the car park and could also potentially cause damage to the kerbing and grass.

We therefore request that vehicles are only parked in marked bays. If you are unable to park in a marked bay because the car park is full, please park further away on a road nearby but not directly in front of the Co-Op shop next door. This may mean that you need to 'drop off' your passengers and then find a space elsewhere. The car park is of course available for everyone to use, however, we ask that priority be given to those who have a greater need to use the car park due to mobility, health or other reasons, for example, musicians bringing in equipment for worship, young families with prams, etc..

Please therefore consider if you really do need to park in the car park, particularly on a Sunday morning when the building is busy, and please only park in a disabled bay if you have a blue badge. If you do park anywhere other than a marked bay, please do not be offended when we ask you to move your vehicle. Thank you.



Peace and 'The Peace'

Dictionary definitions of 'peace' include: the state existing during the absence of war; absence of violence or other disturbance; a state of harmony and friendship; absence of mental anxiety; a state of stillness, silence or serenity.

When we pray for 'peace' the above are amongst any number of things we have in mind. The 'peace of God' however is a supernatural peace that God offers us in the midst of life's trials and tribulations. It cannot be defined and explained by human logic. It is something you know if there when you've got it and/or are experiencing it.

The word 'peace' occurs about 250 times in the bible and most come under the dictionary definitions I have listed. Here are a few of the bible references that mention peace of the supernatural kind. I invite you to look them up, even reading the verses either side of them for the purpose of their context.

- Philippians 4 verse 7 reminds us that the peace of God 'transcends all understanding'.
- Ephesians 2 verse 14 reminds us that Christ 'Himself is our peace', confirming Isaiah 9 verse 6 which tells us the Messiah is amongst other things the 'prince of peace.'
- In Romans 8 verse 6 'peace' is coupled with 'life' and elsewhere it is paired up with such things as grace, mercy and love.
- On three occasions following his resurrection Jesus appears to his disciples and greets them with the words 'Peace be with you', see John 20 verses 19, 21 and 26.
- Then there is the wonderful promise of Jesus. 'Peace I leave with you, my peace I give you.' What a gift!! John 14 verse 29.
- Peace comes from God because He is a God of Peace, Romans 15 verse 33.

When then, during the Holy Communion, we offer one another a sign of peace, do we realise the importance of that moment, the seriousness of that moment? We are offering and receiving the Peace of God, a supernatural peace, a spiritual peace together with all the things that go with it. What a privilege. What a joy.
