

Lent at St Alphege Seasalter


Lent is the period of six weeks (40 days not including Sundays) that starts on Ash Wednesday (5th March), and leads up to Easter.

Christians use the time to think more deeply about faith, about the impact of sin, and why we (and the world) need Jesus.

Ash Wednesday 5 March - Services

- 2.30 pm Mid Week Holy Communion Service, at SCC (with opportunity to receive an ash cross)
- 7.30 pm Evening Ash Wednesday Holy Communion Service at SCC a reflective service to begin Lent facing our human frailties, failings and need but find the unconditional love of Christ meeting us as we do that.

'The Narrow Path' Sermons During Lent



During the 5 Sundays of Lent, our sermon series will be based on a book by Rich Villodas called 'The Narrow Path - How the subversive way of Jesus satisfies our souls'.

We'll be looking at 'What is the Narrow Path?', 'Being Salt and Light', 'Anger and Anxiety', 'Our Judgements and Enemies' and 'Our Decisions'.

There will be Connect Group questions based on the sermons each week. I'd recommend

the book, which is very readable, full of good stuff, and covers more topics than we can fit into 5 weeks - but it's not essential that you have it in order to follow along.
