

The Bungalow Update

Most of you will know we had to made the decision some months ago to sell the bungalow, due to the financial pressures that were facing the church. It has not sold.

Financial changes

In the meantime, God has been at work in amazing ways, and we have found ourselves, due to people's generosity in giving and donations, in a much better financial position than we expected to be in. Additionally, it looks like we will soon be able to put Solar Panels on the Christian Centre roof (we have a restricted pot of donations towards this project) which will help us bring our electricity costs down further.

Can we retain the Bungalow?

We have been exploring whether it is possible to pay off the mortgage on the bungalow, so that it can be refurbished for a Youth Hub and for other community and church uses during the day when Youth activities are not in session

We should soon be in a position to tell the church community the target amount that remains to be raised in order to pay off the mortgage, and refurbish the bungalow.

In the meantime, please pray:

- For the DCC/Leadership and for us as a church family to hear what the Holy Spirit is saying to us about the building. For wisdom in our financial planning and decision making.
- For God to provide what we need to close the gap. For Hannah our Youth Minister, and for the young people of our church and community.

Lord, we thank you for your generous grace to us. Help us to do your will and to make the right decisions about the resources you have given us.
