You can register for free at <https://tinyurl.com/mvr3u6pf> and, even better, you will get a 10% discount on parking in town well after this offer ends.





Vacancy

We currently have a vacancy at the Wynn Ellis Alms-houses. It is for an upstairs flat, which is up quite a steep set of stairs. Rent is just over £80 a week plus utilities. The Wynn Ellis Alms-houses are situated very close to Whitstable Castle. Applicants must be over 60 and be both single and female. This is due to the Charitable Trust requirements set up in the 19th century when they were originally built. They must have also have lived in Whitstable for over 10 years and be able to prove this. Also, they need to show they have very limited savings and income to be shortlisted. Any ownership of property for example, would not be possible.

If you are interested, please send a letter to Mr G S Wootton at P O Box 1247 Whitstable CT1 9UT explaining that you fit the criteria, and he will then send you an application form. 
Lent @ St Alphege Seasalter
